

MOM+ DAUGHTER DATE

“Do you still love me?”

Has your daughter ever asked you that question, either with her words or just with her eyes after she’s done something wrong?

When a child learns that you still love them after they’ve done something wrong, it’s laying a beautiful foundation for the gospel of God’s unconditional love.

And do you know what’s another great foundation for talking about the gospel? Food! In this case, TACOS! I don’t know about you, but I’ve learned my kids will talk about all kinds of things when we’re doing something together or just munching on snacks.

So whether you create a whole taco bar for this month’s mom+daughter date or head on down to Taco Bell, remember this: It’s not about the tacos! It’s about knowing the gospel and sharing it with others.

You know, as I’ve traveled around with True Girl and shared the message of salvation from the stage, I’ve learned a very important thing. Tween girls totally get it! The gospel strikes their hearts and grabs a hold of their minds. They can understand verses like John 3:16 and Romans 10:9. And they want to be able to share that gospel message with others!

If your daughter is 100% sold out for Jesus, this month will be amazing as she learns how to share Christ with others. If your daughter has yet to make that decision, I’m praying this month will be her time to accept that free gift of salvation!

SUBJECT:
Understanding the
Wordless Book

SETTING:
Your home or a taco restaurant

MATERIALS YOU'LL NEED:
Your Bible

The Wordless Book (from your
box or digital dashboard)

Tacos (or taco-making supplies)

Talk about the gospel together. Tell her your own testimony if you like. Talk about people you know who don't follow Jesus and pray for an opportunity to share the Wordless Book with them. And of course, if your daughter hasn't given her life to Jesus and she's ready, go ahead and walk her through that now.



Let's Taco 'Bout Jesus!



In this mom+daughter date, you and your daughter will learn a simple way of explaining the gospel of Jesus Christ—while you eat tacos!



HERE'S WHAT TO DO FOR THIS DATE:

- 1 Decide what kind of taco experience you want to have. Here are a few ideas:**
 - a. Get a taco-making kit from the grocery store and any toppings you would like and create a taco bar at home.
 - b. Order out or go to a restaurant that sells tacos. (Maybe try a new type of taco!)
 - c. Go all out and create a whole taco bar party with banners, taco-themed decorations, and festive music.

- 2 Have fun making and eating tacos.** Easy, right? Just enjoy each other for a bit while you crunch, munch, and lunch together.

- 3 When your hands aren't covered in salsa and sour cream, talk about the Wordless Book.** If you're not sure how to explain it, here's some help:

The Wordless Book is unique because it tells a powerful story, even though there are no words in the book. Instead of words, it uses colors that are symbols. You get to supply the words! Each color represents something different about the Gospel:

- ♥ **BLACK** - This color reminds us of sin. Sin is when we choose to do something that's against how God wants us to live.
{Bible Verse: Romans 3:23 "For everyone has sinned; we all fall short of God's glorious standard."}
- ♥ **RED** - The color red is a symbol of the blood of Jesus. He sacrificed His life for us because He loves us.
{Bible Verse: 1 John 1:7 "But if we are living in the light, as God is in the light, then we have fellowship with each other, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, cleanses us from all sin."}
- ♥ **WHITE** - This color reminds us that when we repent of our sins and accept Christ's forgiveness, we are made clean and pure!
{Bible Verse: 1 John 1:9 "But if we confess our sins to him, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all wickedness."}
- ♥ **GREEN** - Green is all about growing in our faith. When we accept God's free gift of salvation through Jesus, we begin to grow as we follow Him.
{Bible Verse: Romans 12:2 "Don't copy the behavior and customs of this world, but let God transform you into a new person by changing the way you think. Then you will learn to know God's will for you, which is good and pleasing and perfect."}
- ♥ **GOLD** - This color represents heaven. Those who live for Jesus on Earth will spend eternity with Him in heaven after they die!
{Bible Verse: John 3:16 "For this is how God loved the world: He gave his one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have eternal life."}



Every now and then you and your daughter can quiz each other on what the different colors mean so you're both ready to share the gospel of Jesus wherever you go!
